What we did:



We spoke to almost 1500 residents



Another 800+ completed an online survey

We spent 150 hours engaging with residents across 65 separate events.





Here's what residents told us

- · Cost of living crisis
- Access to healthcare (doctors and dentists)
- Affordable homes
- Services and facilities for young people
- Wanting to get more 'involved' in the community

Back in the summer of 2022, Knowsley Council were out and about across the borough talking to residents and finding out more about what people, families and businesses need to thrive both now and in the future.

Overwhelmingly the feedback from residents – young and old – was really positive. Many people commented on how proud they were of their area, how much they enjoy accessing good local facilities on their doorstep and how they feel part of a supportive local community.

We also asked people lots of questions about money issues, housing, town centres and more. We wanted to understand how people were feeling after a tough couple of years and find out what matters most to our communities.





The cost of living crisis

Over 90% of people who took part in the consultation said the cost of living crisis was a major concern.

How the crisis is impacting our residents

Made moderate changes to spending 48%

Made major changes to spending 43%

Not affected / unsure / prefer not to say 9%

Most impacted: Working aged people, age 35-44, with children




80% of people said they were most impacted by rising costs of food and fuel.

Transport costs, mortgages and childcare costs were also mentioned as being a major worry.



Young people recognise the dangers of crime and criminality.








What our older residents had to say
